Records of where different species of wildlife can be seen are vitally important. You can help by filling in and returning this form, recording where and when you see different species. These could be birds, butterflies, plants – in fact anything at all that you can confidently identify. Even records of common species can be useful. Try to identify the precise species wherever possible (e.g. ‘Great-spotted Woodpecker’ is better than ‘Woodpecker’) but be truthful – better to record that you don’t know rather than guess. If you can’t identify a species try to take a photo and send it to us

and we will do our best to identify it for you. As well as a place name, a grid reference is useful to identify the precise location. If you need more space then please photocopy the second page as many times as you need, but remember to include your name on all sheets. Thank you.
